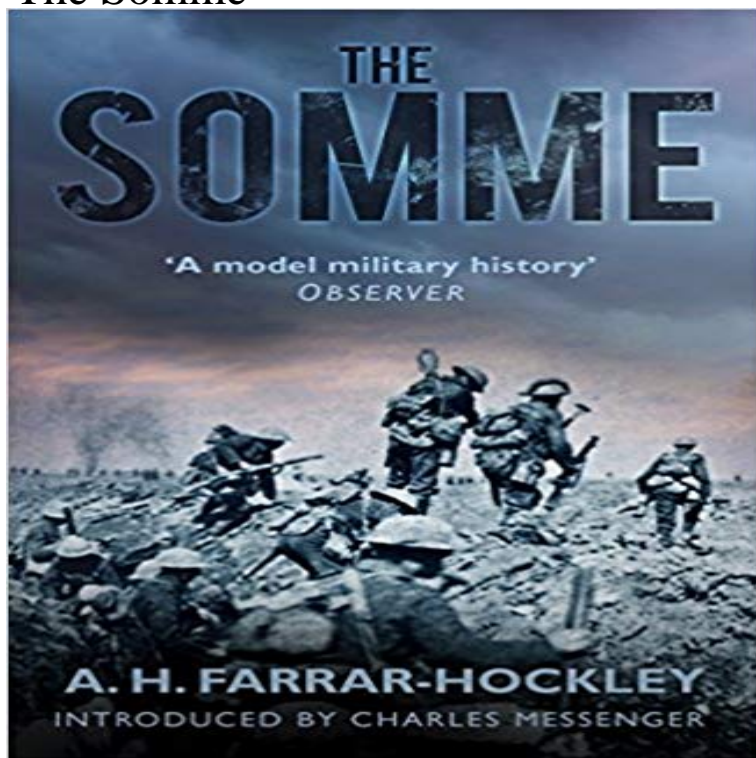


## The Somme
